Part B

CRITERION I – CURRICULAR ASPECTS

1.1 - Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 – Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

Shailendra College was founded by Government employees' majority of them working in Mantrayalaya (State Secretariat) to provide education to the local community at affordable cost. Our Society is registered under Society's Registration Act bearing Registration no. BOM.122/1976 GBBSD. The College was founded in 1994 and is affiliated to University of Mumbai. The College has students belonging to different caste, linguistic and religious groups imparting secular education and promoting communal harmony. It is located in Dahisar the last suburb of Western Mumbai close to Western Express Highway and easily accessible by public transport. Majority of the students live in vicinity of College. It is a multi-faculty College having 5 UG, 1 PG programmes and two Research Centres in the subject of Business Economics and Business Policy and Administration. Our college appoints teaching staff as per the educational qualifications stipulated by the UGC and University. IQAC plays a vital role in planning and implementation of curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities of all the Departments and Committees. The compliance of Academic Calendar is monitored by IQAC. For the smooth functioning of academic programs department wise, teacher wise time tables were prepared for lectures, tutorials and practicals to be conducted in the laboratory. The Time-table was displayed on the notice boards for the teaching staff and students. The teachers were allotted the courses based on their educational qualifications and areas of interest and specialization. Academic calendar was prepared at the beginning of the year and it was published on the website. The teachers prepared month wise teaching plan for the entire academic year at the commencement of the year for efficient curriculum delivery. A detailed daily diary was maintained by each teacher to ensure adequate flexibility in timely completion of the syllabus. Apart from the traditional method of chalk and talk teachers made use of modern methods of teaching using ICT (Information and Communication Technology) such as Google Classroom, Smart boards etc. These were useful in conducting tests and assignment. Besides lectures, tutorials were used for a more personalized attention to the students. The Departments and Committees conducted various co-curricular and extra-curricular and Extension activities, which were normally planned at the commencement of the academic year and listed in the academic calendar. The activities included Seminars, Workshops, Guest lectures, Industrial visits, study tours to areas of historical importance etc which added value to Teaching-Learning process. Industrial Visits to various industrial establishments

exposed them to the Processes and functioning of the industry which enhanced the employability of the students. We also conduct Bridge and Remedial courses. Feedback is taken from the students which helps in knowing the areas that needs improvement. The College had 30 hours Add on courses and Value added courses. Feedback Obtained

Our College followed structured feedback system for effective curriculum delivery. The College collected feedback from various stakeholders such as students, teachers, alumni and parents on course, syllabus, teachers and infrastructure. The college also collected feedback on activities conducted by using Google form. An elaborate and structured questionnaire is prepared for getting valuable inputs from various stakeholders of the education system viz. Students, Teachers, Employers, Alumni and Parents etc. The questionnaire seeks to gather the opinions and perceptions of various stakeholders on the contents, relevance, utility, adequacy of the syllabus. It also assesses the practical application in terms of employability and skilldevelopment and it's covering contemporary issues. The feedback on teachers pertained to Syllabus completion. The feedback on infrastructure related to adequacy and utility of the facilities provided. The College had also gathered feedback from Alumni on Infrastructure, Quality of teaching, college activities, facilities and learning experience. The College had also gathered feedback from Parents on teaching, college activities, placement and transparency in evaluation. The collected feedback was analysed and the inferences were communicated to the concerned teachers and authorities. Based on the feedback collected from various stakeholders, the college started new Addon courses and Value added courses. We get students from the lower middle class vicinity of our college. Most of the students are first generation learners, who have completed their schooling in vernacular medium. Some of them find difficulties in instructions in English. Many students do part time jobs to support their family. Some of the advance learners from Commerce stream pursue professional courses like C.A., C.S. and ICWA along with graduation. These students find it difficult to balance their college studies and professional courses studies as well as domestic commitments as they lack guidance at home regarding their studies and career. Every year students are allotted to teachers who act as their Mentor. They discuss with the Mentor their career plans, studies and try to address the problems faced therein. For their psychological issues they are directed to a Personal Counsellor appointed by the college. Teachers try to understand the academic background of the students. Needy students are informed about Book Bank and Scholarship facilities. Teachers solve queries of students and also provide them reference books and textbooks. Students are assisted to improve their learning level. They are also motivated to appear for campus placements and competitive exams. Those who have difficulty in writing in English are permitted to write papers in vernacular language after proper discussion with the Mentor. The students also explain their financial constraints to the Mentor. The Mentor then brings it to notice of the Principal and instalment facility is arranged for those students.

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2.5.2 - Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

College is following semester pattern of examination system. The Self Finance Courses (BMS, B.Com (BI), B.Sc.(IT)) and M.Com students are evaluated through Internal and external assessment. In every semester there is internal and external examination with 25:75 pattern for under graduate and 60:40 pattern for post graduate programs. At the Under Graduate level the University has allowed 25 of the marks to be decided through Internal Assessment. In B.Sc. (I.T.) students are required to complete prescribed practical work for 50 marks. In M.Com 40 of the marks are allotted through Internal Assessment. From 2016, the University has scrapped internal assessment for traditional B.A. and B.Com courses. However there is project work of 25 marks in the subject of Foundation Course for FY and SY Classes. From 2016, teachers conduct informal internal assessment by way of class tests, project presentations, oral tests, group discussions, assignments, remedial and tutorial lectures. At the beginning of the semester students are oriented about the evaluation process. After completion of half of the syllabus the teachers assess knowledge of the students. Doubts and difficulties of students are understood through internal evaluation and revision lectures are conducted for the same. During revision lectures teachers not only revise various concepts but also discuss past years question papers. Question Banks are provided to the students. For Third year students preliminary examinations are conducted before the semester end examination.

2.5.3 – Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

University prepares term dates and holidays and sends it to colleges. College plans the Academic Calendar of the Curricular, Cocurricular and Extracurricular activities and publishes it in the Prospectus and uploads it on college website before the commencement of academic year. It gives detail of different activities to be conducted month wise. Parents are apprised through parents meeting. Academic calendar gives detail schedule of admission, internal examination, external examination project and viva submission. It also gives detailed schedule of cultural activities, Industrial Visits, NSS camps and activities of different committees well in advance. It facilitates faculty and students to plan in detail about co curricular and extracurricular activities. Since the academic calendar is published well in advance the continuous internal evaluation is done as per schedule. The process of preparing and execution of academic calendar is as follows: In the staff meetings Examination Schedule is described in detail for Internal, Semester, Practical, ATKT and Additional Examinations. Teacher: At the beginning of the year every teacher is assigned the subjects to be taught. The teachers prepare teaching plan and evaluation schedule of assigned subject. Students are informed about teaching plan and exam dates in the first lecture of the term. • Head of the Department: Most of the departments in Aided Section are single member whereas in Self Finance are multimember. So for Regular Courses Principal and for Self Finance Section the Coordinators supervise the academic planning and execution.

Responsibility of overall supervision of infrastructure facilities, services and equipment rests with the College Development Committee. Funds required for the purpose are allocated in the annual budget. Computer Laboratory - Computers are protected by antivirus software. A weekly time table of Class wise practicals has been prepared by respective lecturers for the laboratories. Outdated Computers and printers are disposed off. Two Laboratory Attendants are

appointed by the College for maintenance of IT infrastructure. In the budget, provision is made for Annual Maintenance Contracts for maintaining hardware. The replacements of damaged parts of computers are undertaken immediately. The cleaning and dusting of laboratories is undertaken by sweepers. A dead Stock Verification of all laboratory equipments is undertaken every year. Library is well lit with LED lights and secured with three CCTV cameras. Zerox machine and Water cooler are maintained by A.M.C. Library Attendants are maintaining the library. Library is regularly cleaned by sweepers. A stock verification of library books is conducted once in every two years. The work of prevention of leakage from the roof is undertaken as and when required. The scrap is also regularly weeded out. Library fees are spent on books and journals. Sports Ground -Sports Director ensures the utilization of Playground and maintenance of sports equipments of the College. Sports material is stacked in the cupboard. Soil is replenished every year. Coaching of outdoor sports is provided by the Sports Director. Practice and warm up sessions are taken in Gymkhana. Indoor games are conducted in gymkhana. The Rifle shooting range has been developed on the ground floor. Dead Stock Verification of Sports equipment is undertaken every year. Computers and Printers are regularly maintained. Cartridges are regularly refilled. Classrooms are allotted as per the student strength. Lectures and practicals are regularly monitored. Different committees have been formed for the smooth functioning of college curricular and extracurricular activities. The damaged LCD projectors have been replaced. Daily cleaning of all facilities is undertaken by peon and sweepers. Sanitary material is regularly provided to sweepers. Regular maintenance are undertaken by following agencies Maintenance of Campus: A gardener has been appointed to maintain the butterfly garden and ground. A Security Guard has been appointed to maintain security. Two sweepers have been appointed for house keeping and cleaning work. A team of sweepers has been appointed to clean the entire premises including classrooms, laboratories, library and passages. Cleaning of water tanks is undertaken every six months. A Mock Fire Drill has been conducted on 23rd March 2019 to create awareness among students and staff on how a building can be evacuated in the event of a fire or other emergency. Training has been provided to the staff. 33 Fire extinguishers and 6 buckets have been purchased for Fire Safety and are placed at prominent places.

The college has jumped to the 5th overall rank in more than 700 Colleges of the University of Mumbai. In the first meeting between the Principal, IQAC coordinator and the Sports Director, the event dates, budget and the structure of the event was planned. The event proposal was then formalized and sent for the approval in the CDC (College Development Committee) as the decision making body. Once approved in the CDC Meeting conducted on 1st December 2018 and the dates confirmed, a meeting was arranged for the orientation of the staff and the delineation of the work. Under the overall leadership of the Gymkhana Committee, subcommittees were created. Follow up meetings were arranged with individual subcommittees subsequently for monitoring the progress. Wherever realized, additional support members were provided for completion of the work. The event was conducted on 3 days during 1012th January 2019 at the Kaman Campus of Shailendra Education Society. The event was a grand success as participation of teams from far flung colleges depicted. In all the decentralized manner of governance proved the mean to achieve this success. AROMA The second case study to understand the decentralization would be the annual academic three day fest 'AromaTalent in our DNA' for upgrading student's knowledge about the current trends in sectors like education, employment, industry, etc. The planning regarding determining events was done at the IQAC level based on three criteria a. Interest of students b. Capabilities and expertise of Staff Members c. Relevance of the competition in the current scenario. Based on these three criteria it was decided after through conversations with the different departments and Coordinators that the competitions and workshops regarding GST, Stock Markets, Emoney, Company Arbitrations and Merges etc should feature primly in the events. Hence the following events were conducted. Each staff member was given a specific task for the smooth functioning of the each event. Guests and Judges were invited from outside so that there is a neutral and professional assessment of each event. The following are the events were held during the festival 1. GST Calculation Competition 2. virtual stock market 3. Moot Court 4. 7P'S of Marketing 5. Innovations in Insurance 6. Payment Banks Practices 7. Role of Regulatory Bodies 8. Mergers Acquisitions 9. Automation Testing Tool Workshop The Aroma fest turned out to be a grand success and received overwhelming response from the students.

More than 2000 paper bags were made by the students and distributed among the vendors around the college. A 'Nature Trail' to Sanjay Gandhi National Park Borivali was organized on 18th August, 2018. Mrs. Vidya Mundale was the expert and guide throughout the trail. On 18th August, 2018 the volunteers of NSS and Nature Club organized a cleanliness drive in the Sanjay Gandhi National Park Borivali. They collected all the plastics and plastic bottles around the track of the 'Vanrani' a mini toy train running in SGNP and cover around 2.5km. BMC area outside the college campus was reclaimed and maintained by the Nature Club . On 6th February, 2019, a compost sale which was harvested from the college compost pit was organized to make the public aware of the value of waste. Green Auditing was conducted by "SENERGY Consultants" (P) Ltd on 9th and 10th May 2019. 7.2 - Best Practices

7.2.1 – Describe at least two institutional best practices

Title of the Practice: Vermicomposting Objectives of the Practice: • To sensitize the students about need of waste management. • Create an organic waste management model for the households in cities. • Make the students aware of the value of waste. • To protect the biodiversity. The Context: Our College is always in the forefront in sensitising the students about social problems and finding solution to the problems. Way back in 2008 we started vermicomposting project as a solution to organic waste management in cities. The Practice: "Reduce, Reuse and Recycle" is the slogan we strictly follow to deal with waste. Our Vermicomposting Project is a step towards Clean and Green city.NSS unit and Nature Club of our college started the project in 2008 in a simplex tank. A vermicomposting shed of 2.30×1×0.4 cubic m with 6 working composting pits was constructed. The harvested compost is used in Butterfly garden and other green areas of the campus. On 9th January, 2019 members of Nature Club harvested the compost from vermicomposting pits and reactivated the plant. They added organic waste and earthworms. Slurry of cow dung was sprayed on it. Then waste was covered with green leaves. Regular monitoring of the vermicomposting was done by the volunteers. After four months the compost was ready to use. On 6th February, 2019, sale of compost was organized. The objective of the sale was to spread the message among the students and teachers of 'the value of waste'. The staff and students wholeheartedly participated in the sale. An amount of Rs.900 was collected from the sale. In addition to this the members continued to maintain the Butterfly Garden to protect different types of butterflies. New nectar plants were planted in the garden. Evidence of Success: The College is composting the garden waste and canteen waste. We harvest around 1000 kg of compost every year. Our vermicomposting project was appreciated in the newspaper. Members of Nature Club also helped to start vermicomposting in housing society. Our students also helped in starting a vermicomposting project at Ambika Yoga Kutir main center at Kelve. Practice 2 Title of the Practice: Solar Energy Project Objectives of the Practice: • To reduce the dependency on fossil fuel energy. • To become a model to other institutes and housing societies in the suburban areas to switch on to renewable and green energy technologies. • To make the students aware of the benefits of solar energy. • To protect environment. The Context: The College incurred bills of Rs. 345640 and Rs. 81660 for its two meter nos. 7665757 and 7764931 respectively in the year 2017. To reduce the electricity bills and as a step towards reducing carbon footprint, the college decided to go for Solar Energy Project. The Practice: The initial investment of the project was Rs. 23,00,000/. The project life is 25 years. The cost recovery period was calculated as 2 years 10 months. Saving after recovery period was estimated as Rs. 3,90,00

Entrepreneurship is the key to India's development. To fulfill this vision IITBombay conceptualized successfully implemented various initiatives to help students, young entrepreneurs and professionals in their entrepreneurial journey. They have started an ECell to achieve this goal. Entrepreneurship -

Summit (ESummit) is an annual flagship event of IITBombay under ECell. This is a conference of visionary students, professionals or anybody who has a passion to start his own business or fund a venture and become a trendsetter. E Summit 19 organised by IIT Bombay was attended by our 32 students and two faculty members on 19th and 20th January 2019. This provided our students exposed to people with various initiatives, success and failures. In collaboration with IIT - Bombay, our college had organized a one day workshop on 'Entrepreneurship and Business Skills' on 5th October, 2018. In all 80 students had participated in that workshop from all streams. The fee of Rs. 52000/ @Rs. 650/ per participant was paid by the College. Mr. Saurabh Jambure and Mr. Ali Husen were the resource persons for the workshop. Students were oriented about startups and intricacies related to Entrepreneurship, scripting B model, marketing and finance etc. The high light of the workshop was that the students were trained in finance, pricing strategies, importance of branding and how to startup a venture. Hands on experience with business model was provided in the workshop. It was a highly interactive and motivational session for the students as they learned a lot about startups from this workshop. The College name was displayed on IIT portal. Students were given ecertificates.
